YOT Health Arrangements

Appointment & Assessments

Indicator explanation

This indicator shows how many young people have engaged in a health service specifically with YOT nurse intervention where a) case managers have cause for concern and the young person had previously not had this need identified and/or met; b) the young person has known health needs prior to YOT but has previously not engaged in health services. The YOT nurse has supported their engagement into the relevant health service, providing advocacy and practical help such as arranging appointments, health specialist assessments and accompanying them to the specialist intervention. All Bexley children and young people that are arrested within the local area are screened by the YOT Nurse, if need is identified appointments will be offered, in Liaison with the Adult L&D Team 100% of young people referred to the YOT nurse are expected to have a full CHAT/health assessment if a health need is identified.

YOT Health Nurse Commentary

Total seen Q2 = 35 Triage-23 Stat- 10 Youth Conditional Cautions (YCC) -2. Other - 0 When young people do not attend their scheduled appointments contact is made with them/their parents/carers to offer subsequent appointments. Their case worker is also informed and the YOT nurse can use their statutory appointments with their case worker to see them if agreed. Of those on a statutory order who engaged, 10 Comprehensive Health Assessment Tool (CHAT) assessments were completed, all young people referred to the YOT nurse had a sexual health discussion, 7 young people accepted a C card, 9 accepted condoms, 10 were seen for substance misuse, 8 were referred to the substance misuse nurse for further intervention. For the young people seen via Triage 18 health assessments were completed, all had a sexual health/growing up talk, 6 accepted C cards and 11 accepted condoms, some young people seen via Triage already had C cards hence only accepted condoms. 3 were referred to the substance misuse nurse for further input, 2 were referred to the speech and language therapist, 1 young person was referred to the commissioned service for further support, 1 young person was referred to the YOT education worker, 1 parent/guardian refused YOT nurse intervention, Of the Triage young people who did not attend letters were sent home to them by the YOT nurse asking them to make contact at a later date should they need support. 1 triage young person who had subsequent appointments booked for further work did not attend as moved abroad, 2 young people on YCC were seen, 1 was already being assessed by the community paediatrician and had a CHAT assessment. 5 young people attended the group sessions for substance misuse out of the 11 referred.

Screening and Visits

Indicator explanation

The YOT nurse sees young people at the Bexley Civic Centre, Bexley Youth Advice, in their homes/residential placements or at school when needed.

Young offenders sometimes fail to engage or have access to primary care. Examples of this include lack of awareness and/or access to age related immunisations, or they have moved boroughs and are not sure who their GP is. This check by the YOT health nurse ensures that they have a GP and that the young person and the YOT are aware of the GP practice they are registered with. This check may also result in the YOT health nurse advocating services for the young person with the GP surgery such as medication reviews, medical diagnosis and treatment and immunisations.

YOT Health Nurse Commentary

The YOT nurse checks immunisation status as well as GP registration on the RIO(NHS) software of all referrals sent to her prior to scheduled appointments with the young people. The YOT nurse screens the custody lists daily and can identify if young people are not registered with a General Practitioner and signpost/support young people in registering with one. Some of the young people seen between April and June had GP's registered out of borough.

Types of interventions delivered by the YOT Health Nurse

Indicator explanation

The YOT nurse has experience in giving one to one/group advice on sexual health, substance misuse/healthy eating/healthy relationships/sleep advice/hygiene/mental and emotional wellbeing etc. Where the YOT nurse identifies the need for further specialist involvement she is able to refer to appropriate services.

YOT Health Nurse Commentary

Young people referred to the YOT nurse will usually have a session on healthy relationships and sexual health, where the nurse identifies further need, an in-depth session will be offered. Out of the young people seen by the YOT nurse for the 2nd quarter all had general sessions on healthy relationships, child sexual exploitation, age of consent. Some of the young people seen by the YOT nurse who need substance misuse/emotional health support sometimes refuse a referral to onward agencies, the YOT nurse therefore offers advice and guidance. The YOT nurse also gave specific advice to all the young people in relation to sleep, hygiene and healthy eating.
